

An Arkansas-born, Texas-bred musical road warrior, Sleepy LaBeef has been playing gigs across America and overseas for more than 55 years, and at 76 years old his powers are still undiminished. Standing 6'7" with a rumbling basso-profundo voice and driving electric guitar style, he is known to many of his fans as "The Human Jukebox" because of his huge repertoire of songs.

Sleepy LaBeef Rides Again centers on a live concert recorded in Nashville in early 2012 and a recording session at RCA Studio B the following morning. In front of an enthusiastic crowd, Sleepy, backed by an all-star band including guitarist Kenny Vaughan and bassist/producer Dave Pomeroy, takes the audience — and band — on an epic journey, demonstrating that there is no artist alive who has a better grasp of American roots music. Sleepy was a witness at the birth of rock and roll, and his music crosses all borders from rockabilly to gospel, country, blues, and more.

Music historian Peter Guralnick is interviewed in the film, calling Sleepy "one of the greatest live performers of this or any other era," and Rides Again proves his point. Director Seth Pomeroy weaves four short documentary segments into the live concert, providing essential insight into a unique artist who is into his seventh decade of making music. Studio footage, interviews, and archival segments explore the fascinating world of Sleepy LaBeef — the greatest Americana music artist you almost never heard of.
